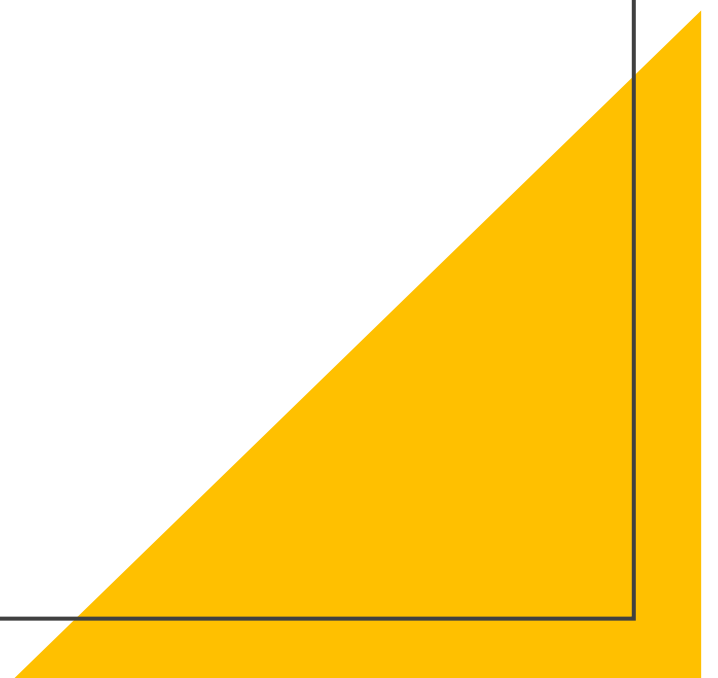

# Action G5.5 Legislative Agenda

- **G5.5 – legislative agenda:** Prioritize climate mitigation policy in the municipalities’ legislative agenda each year. Instruct municipal lobbyists to track and report on climate bills, and advocate for those bills that will help reduce local emissions. Work with other jurisdictions across the state to add this to the priorities for the Association of Washington Cities and Washington State Association of Counties.






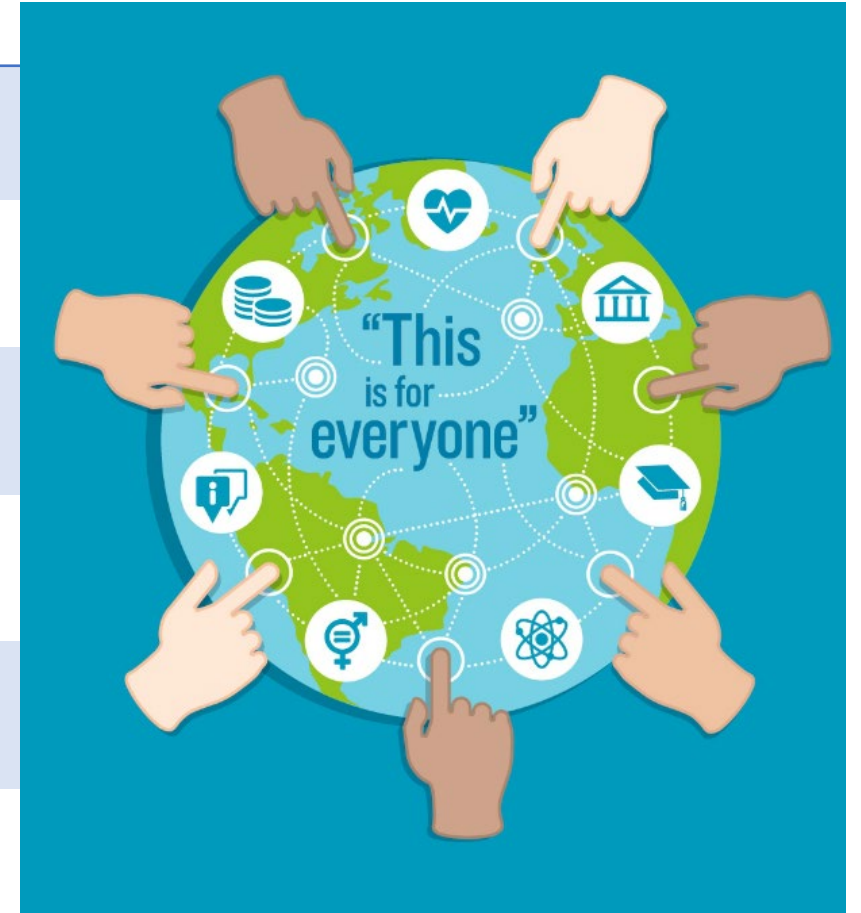
HB 1280	Electrification of State Funded Buildings	✓	Passed and signed – effective 6/9/2022
HB 1766	Clean Heat Act	✗	Did not pass out of House committee
HB 1770	Strengthening energy codes (residential reach code)	✗	Passed House and Senate EET committee, but stalled in Senate Rules
SB 5722	Benchmarking for multifamily and commercial buildings 20,000-50,000 sq ft	✓	Passed and signed – effective 6/9/2022
SSB 5974	Move Ahead WA Transportation Package	✓	Passed and signed – effective 6/9/2022
SB 5312	Transit-oriented development grants	✗	Passed Senate, but did not pass out of House committee
SB 5633/ HB 1895	Keep Washington Green Act	✗	Did not pass out of either committee

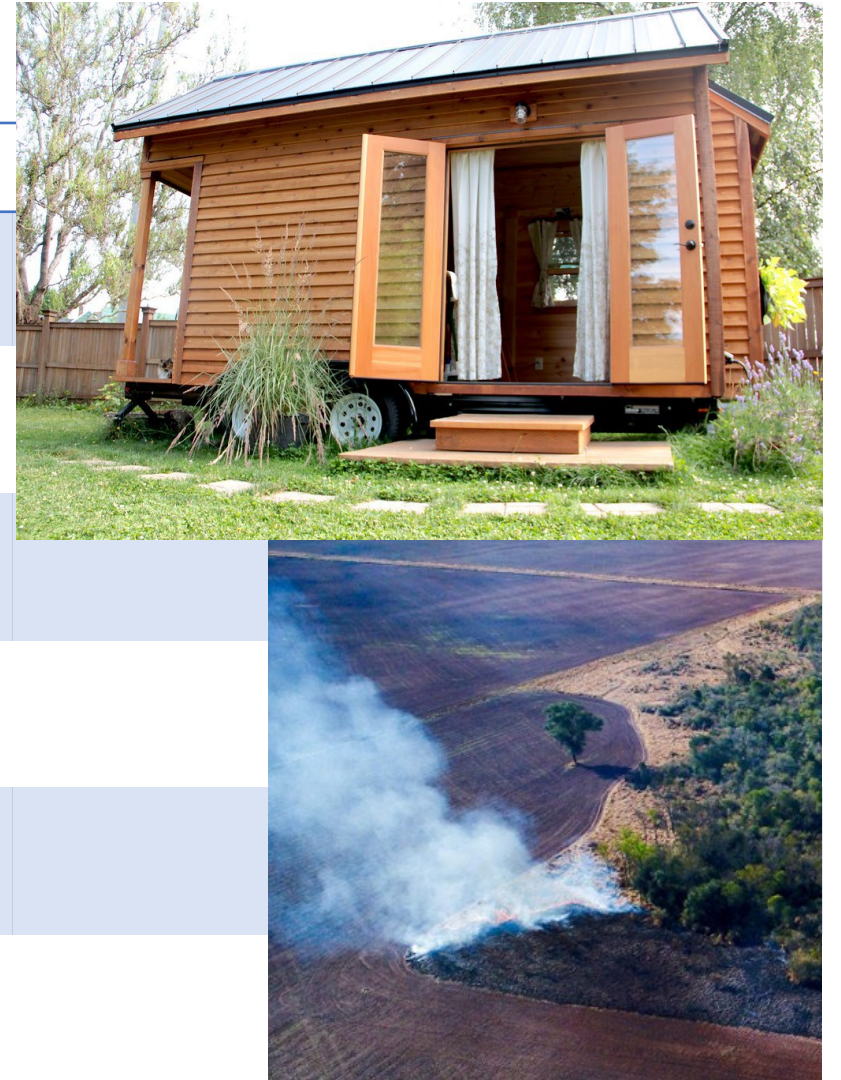

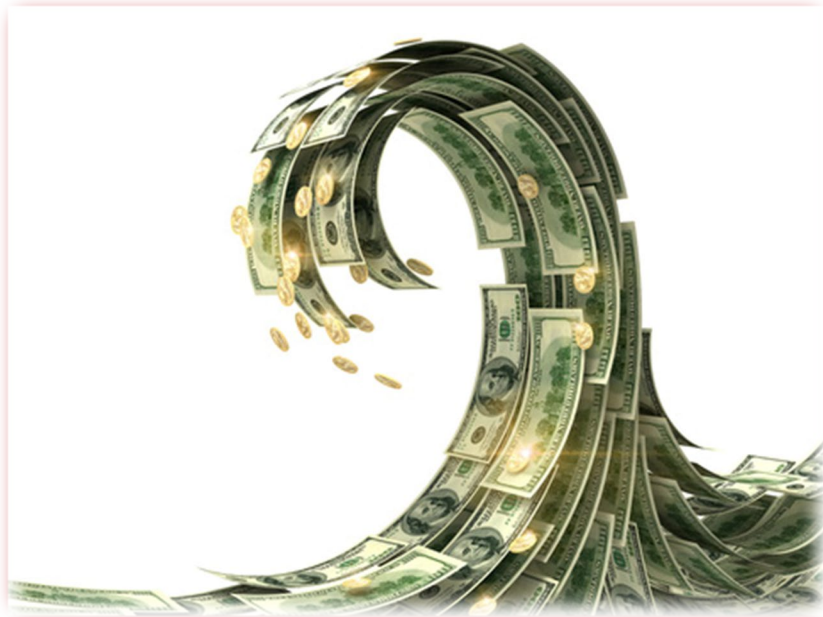
