As the long-range transportation plan for the region, What Moves You is used for planning purposes and does not guarantee the implementation of any projects or programs identified in the plan.

Per regulations, the plan must be updated at least every four years. TRPC reviews the plan on an annual basis to determine what changes may be needed to keep it up to date.

8. List any environmental information you know about that has been prepared, or will be prepared, directly related to this proposal.

A portion of Thurston County is a maintenance area for PM10 (particulate matter 10 microns or less in size). This affects approximately the area of the 1987 city limits of Lacey, Olympia, and Tumwater. The maintenance area is subject to on-road transportation conformity requirements and the Thurston County Second 10-Year Limited Maintenance Plan. The Maintenance Plan describes a margin of safety for annual growth in vehicle miles traveled in the maintenance area. It would require a sustained VMT growth rate of 6.3 percent per year to reach the margin of safety for on-road emissions that could trigger conformity concerns. The actual growth rate is under two percent per year, and is projected to continue falling to near one percent per year by 2040.

Not applicable. *What Moves You* is not property specific. The affected geographic area is Thurston County, Washington.

The plan is based on projections for growth in population, housing, employment, and demand for transportation services. *What Moves You* includes a financially-constrained list of transportation projects and programs from the jurisdictions within Thurston County to construct or complete over the next 25 years. As the long-range transportation plan for the region, *What Moves You* is used for planning purposes and does not guarantee the implementation of any projects or programs identified in the plan.

What Moves You is not site specific. Much of the Lacey-Olympia-Tumwater urban area is a maintenance area subject a Second 10-Year Limited Maintenance Plan for PM10. Transportation conformity analysis shows that annual growth in vehicle miles traveled is well under the margin of safety that could trigger an air quality conformity concern.

b. Are there any off-site sources of emissions or odor that may affect your proposal? If so, generally describe.

What Moves You is not site specific. As described above, mobile source emissions from motor vehicles are analyzed for regional air quality conformity within the context of the plan.

What Moves You is not site specific. The plan includes a variety of policies to help reduce and control potential air impacts. The plan encourages use of alternatives forms of transportation (such as walking, bicycling, and using transit) and alternative commute methods (such as carpooling and telework). The plan adopts aggressive vehicle miles traveled and greenhouse gas reduction goals established by Washington State and by the region's Sustainable Thurston Plan.

While *What Moves You* is a non-project action, the plan uses the regional population and employment forecast together with the regional travel demand model to predict future travel behavior. The analysis for *What Moves You* estimates an increase from approximately 846,000 daily vehicle trips region-wide per day to 1.19 million in 2040. This reflects overall population and employment growth in the region. Peak volumes for vehicular traffic on the regional transportation system are expected to occur in the PM peak period, approximately 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. Each project listed in *What Moves You* is the responsibility of a specific jurisdiction, and its trip generation and peak volumes will be described, as applicable, at the project-specific level by the responsible jurisdiction in the design and permitting phases of a project (project-specific SEPA checklist).

g. Will the proposal interfere with, affect or be affected by the movement of agricultural and forest products on roads or streets in the area? If so, generally describe.

While *What Moves You* is a non-project action, some projects listed in the plan may, during construction, affect or be affected by the movement of agricultural or forest products. The plan incorporates goals to reduce per capita vehicle miles traveled and greenhouse gas production. It promotes active transportation and transportation alternatives to provide access and promote health.

Each project listed in *What Moves You* is the responsibility of a specific jurisdiction, and its measures for reducing and controlling transportation impacts will be described, as applicable, at the project-specific level by the responsible jurisdiction in the design and permitting phases of a project (project-specific SEPA checklist).

What Moves You does not conflict with local, state, or federal laws or requirements for environmental protection. As required in state and federal law, the plan considers environmental impacts related to the development of regional transportation policies and facilities. It includes a discussion, focusing on policies, programs and strategies, for the types of potential environmental mitigation activities and potential areas to carry out these activities. The plan was also reviewed for consistency with countywide planning policies, including those policies addressing environmental protection. The *What Moves You* policies, programs and strategies are regional in scope. Each project listed in *What Moves You* is the responsibility of a specific jurisdiction. Individual projects will be evaluated for consistency with local, state and federal laws and requirements for environmental protection, as applicable, at the project-specific level by the responsible jurisdiction in the design and permitting phases of the project (project-specific SEPA checklist).
